Over the decades, Lupita and her husband Professor David Turner participated in numerous education conferences, including the annual Knowledge, Innovation and Enterprise (KIE) and International Society of Comparative Education, Science and Technology (ISCEST) conferences. It was at a KIE conference that I first met Lupita. Her cordiality and graciousness were immediately perceptible. After this first meeting, our encounters at subsequent conferences grew into a professional, yet sister-like friendship. Lupita was as committed to sharing knowledge as much as she was to acquiring it. This was quite evident in her role as Secretary General of the World Education Fellowship (WEF). Professor James Ogunleye, a member of the WEF International Guiding Committee, gives credence to this sentiment by noting:

Lupita was a pillar of strength and commitment within the WEF International, tirelessly contributing to the success and functioning of the WEF. Her unwavering dedication to the work and activities of the WEF has left an indelible mark, and her absence will be profoundly felt by colleagues, members, and me personally, who I knew and worked with so very closely.

Even more telling, is the announcement made by Editor Professor Ogunleye to honour the departed Secretary General by producing a special issue of *the New Era in Education*, which is the official journal of WEF. For this special issue, colleagues and friends are invited to share their cherished memories and anecdotes of their experiences with Lupita Turner.

ISCEST's Founding President, Professor Steve Azaiki OON, echoes similar warm sentiments on behalf of the ISCEST Family. He recalls Lupita's dedication to promoting lifelong learning for all peoples:

She was transformational in her approach to education and had some forward -looking ideas about what education should look like. I admire her original ideas and
